

Lower School Substitute Teachers

Overview of Position:

Keys School seeks substitute teachers to work as needed. A Bachelors Degree and minimum of successful camp counselor, student teaching or teaching experience are required and a teaching credential, Masters Degree, or coursework completed towards the same is preferred.
